





Greetings,

I have been at Youth for Christ for almost nine years and in that time we have 'lost' youth that frequented The Rock briefly or for many years, even those who 's parents attended years before I was here. My heart has increasingly become heavy, broken, and hurting especially these past months; we have so many youth who feel hopeless or are walking a life of poor choices. I feel an urgency like never before. I struggled myself as a youth and young adult in a dark and hopeless life for a season. It is so difficult to turn the corner, almost impossible without the hope of Jesus.

I recently attended yet another young funeral and I couldn't help but wonder...did the angels rejoice for yet another Christ follower or was Heaven silent? I pray to see many of these young faces when my life comes to an end. It's a hard contemplation. Heaven and hell are both realities.

Recently my Pastor preached on this topic; he shared the agony, never ending, never stopping pain suffered in hell. The next day at our YFC High School Club the topic was "Where do you want to go when you die?" In small groups after the message, we discussed both realities. When hell was mentioned one student (that has been coming here for over 10 years) with a serious expression all of a sudden asked, "What, Hell is for real?" We went on to discuss the topic for a short time. She then repeated the question at least two more times, I think she was waiting for me to say, "Nah, I'm kidding hell is not real." I'm not sure what she was thinking, I wonder if maybe she just thought it's something people say to be mean. During our time talking we dialed back, it's a heavy topic, anxiety was setting in for her just talking about death in itself.

We know that God is the one who knows our hearts and those of others. We are not the judge and jury, only He is. Our responsibility is to build relationships and share the Gospel. I want, no, NEED to tell everyone about Jesus. This life is temporary, eternity is not. I love

people and want to see them in Heaven. We don't know if we have a 'tomorrow.' The time is NOW. There is hope in Jesus.

Thank you for partnering with us so we can share with youth what the Bible says about Heaven and Hell. To present lost youth with the opportunity to receive Jesus as Savior so they can spend eternity in Heaven.

Recently I have been doing a Q&A with the youth at The Rock; some of our kids don't even know who Jesus' birth mother was. When talking about Good Friday and Easter; one of the 15+ youth thought Easter was when Jesus was born. We need to be sharing with our youth about Jesus the Savior, Heaven, and the reality of life without Christ in our lives. Most recently we had five youth answering questions, ones that didn't know answers about Easter previously...one remembered WHO betrayed Jesus and HOW He died. I was ecstatic! They were also excited they knew the answers. God Bless

I am 21 years old. My favorite thing to do in my free time is going on runs at the YMCA with my running partner, who is also my friend. I also love to go on long walks, while listening to music.

I went to The Rock throughout my school years, and they were there for me whenever I needed them to be. They helped me emotionally, financially, and spiritually. When people I loved died back to back, like my grandma dying of natural causes, my uncle from cancer, and my best friends sister from an epileptic seizure. I felt like this world wanted to cause me pain, and wanted to hurt me in ways I can't even explain, because those were people that I loved with all my heart.

I was 16 years old when they all died, because they died back to back, so that's when I fell into depression and despair. I was doing things I shouldn't have been doing. I was doing drugs, and drinking a lot at parties to try and forget everything that was happening at home, and all the sadness that was in the air. I felt that there was **no hope at all**, and I didn't care about myself, or those around me. I didn't care if I caused them pain, or just didn't care about anything. I had the idea that if I kept those that I cared about at a They helped me distance then I would be good. That's when I spiritually. met staff at The Rock and meeting them changed my

I remember my very first time coming to Prairie River camp for a whole week, it was so fun, and amazing. It was one of the best times of my life, just not having to think about anything at all. To be honest my first time at Camp I was just going there to go rockclimbing. I wasn't looking to find my faith. I remember the night sky with the moon being out, and being by the theater with Greg. We were talking, and I asked for prayer for the headaches that I was having, and just prayers for everything that night. For the very first time the headaches stopped, for so long I had them,

We are still having small groups and between the **six groups** we have, there is an average of about eight kids per group. We have done a lot of fun activities this school year such as: a few scavenger hunts, opportunities to win prizes, PRC Winter Camp, and going out to eat. Though these events have been fun, there is something much more exciting I have seen in the kids.

Since the spring, they have heard messages about anxiety, depression, relationships, bullying, weaknesses, temptations, prayer, and many other topics they have related to. I am unsure if what I say has impacted their life, but I do know in the small groups, they are willing to converse about their feelings. One youth said to me in a small group, "I hate my mother because she chose drugs over me; over her kids." This made my heart heavy because I could see the anger and frustration in the eyes. The last thing I want to see in a youth is them hurting. I told them it is okay to be upset and confused as to why she did that, but still pray for her. They looked down and said "Yeah." I knew they did not like my response, so I told them a story from my life where someone hurt me badly and I still prayed for them. This made them look up and talk to me more about what their mother did.

It can be hard to pray for someone who hurt us, but that is what my challenge will be for the kids throughout the summer. Matthew 5:43-44 says, "You have heard that it was said, 'Love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you."

As our Club is coming to an end for the school year, 89 Middle Schoolers have attended the club. I hope out of these 89 Middle Schoolers, at least one will take what God has spoken to them and applies it to their life.


