Hi, my name is Greg Gudal, and I'm the Executive Director of South Central Minnesota Youth For Christ. I've worked with Youth For Christ for over 30 years. This last year, we worked with **400** kids. Right now, we have kids coming at 8:30 in the morning. Then they're there until 5:30 at night. We do a devotion in the morning before their schooling starts, and we may be serving breakfast and lunch. If we have a program in the evening, which our clubs are currently now going, our evening clubs, Campus Life is happening, and we serve a supper and a meal ahead of time. We're working on a lot of one-on-ones, kids are hanging out at The Rock playing ping pong and other games. Just like before, only wearing masks or shields and things of that nature.

This past summer, we were able to run two camps. And out of that group, **17 kids said that they prayed for the first time in their life to receive Christ. 50-some kids recommitted their lives to following Christ.** One of the cabin leaders shared that in their small group of boys, one of the boys didn't even know his dad. Another boy said that his dad was in prison. And a third one said, "My dad just got out of prison, but he doesn't want anything to do with me." **It breaks my heart sometimes when I hear the troubles and the challenges and the stories that kids go through.**

I mentioned that 17 kids had come to Christ at camp, but one young man who we'd kind of gotten disconnected from during the whole COVID thing when it happened. This was a student that would sit at the clubs, kind of be distant, kind of listen, never want to make a decision, wasn't ready to pray, to trust Christ, but he was sure interested in the message. After we were able to reopen during COVID, this young man came back in and he shared with the staff. He said, "**I decided to follow Jesus. I've tried everything else. I've tried it all. And none of it works. And I want to be a follower of Jesus now.**" We're so thankful that we got to be a little bit of a part of it. And so

did you, as you partner with us. We appreciate your prayers and your support because it changes lives. God changes lives.

Somebody's got to share with the kids that are on the streets, the kids that aren't in the Churches. Somebody's got to share with the kids who don't have a chance to hear it unless we tell them, unless somebody tells them. **My heart is to help kids in any way that I can.** Whether it's food or schooling, to help them to be as successful as they can as an individual, but even more importantly, to know Jesus and to walk with God. So in the busy-ness and craziness of our world, don't forget about the least of these, the kids who need hope, who need the Gospel, who need maybe physical food and clothes. "*Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself.*" Thank you for taking the time to hear a little bit of my heart, and what's going on at Youth For Christ. **We need to reach young people.** And we want to partner with the local Church and other like-minded partners to raise up lifelong followers of Jesus.

In place of our Youth For Christ Banquet this year, we've elected to do a Youth For Christ Fundraising Campaign to work on raising \$200,000 between now and the end of the year. 

[Lori] Oh, it's got to have an impact and a long-term one because anytime Christ comes into your life, He's with you, you know, He lives within you for the rest of your life if you allow Him to be there. And it's just been pretty neat how I've seen these kids in their journey, just growing in their faith. So hopefully that'll continue to be passed on to the next generation. That's my wish and my prayer that God has used us in the past to continue on in the future.

That really changed how I feel about God.



They (The Rock) don't care where you come from, and they don't care what you look like. **They just care about touching your life and being there for you.** From preschool to fifth grade, I was bullied. It was tough, and I never had friends. I was always by myself or always with my mom. And so I would see my sister get invited to all these birthday parties and get invited with all these friends, and I would just be at home.

I just remember coming home crying so many times. The people at The Rock have **made a big difference in my life.** They made me feel really, really good about myself. And the staff there really build me up, and I feel like I can tell them anything. **It really makes you feel at peace knowing that someone is there.**

I chose to serve at The Rock because I just love kids so much. When I was younger, I never really thought I would impact someone as much as I have now. It feels really good. And I think it's so special knowing you changed someone's life. If The Rock wasn't there, I don't think I would have found my self-confidence. I don't think I would have had the friends who I have now. And I think that's just really, really cool how God just works in those miraculous ways. And He really just changes your life, like flips it a 180.





Someone was like, you should go to The Rock. I was like, What? The Rock? Like? There's rocks at my house. What are you talking about?

That's where my life changed, big time.

I think as a kid, as a young kid, I was struggling, because I was took, I was took from my house, from my mom, by DHS. And, for so long, I was so mad. And I felt like, like in foster care or foster home, **no one loved me**. Like, a lot of stuff was going on in there.

Someone was like, you should go to The Rock. It's a fun place where people are always hanging out over there. That's where I felt safe. That's where I felt loved. That's where I felt like I mattered.

After years and years of, you know, abuse and all that stuff. It takes a lot of time for you to trust people. As soon as I went there, I instantly trusted everybody there. They just, they welcome you with open hands. As I was going to The Rock and going to camp and all that stuff it **made me understand my worth**, but also made me understand that Jesus



Christ died for me and that I can be forgiven for every single sin that I've done. He's always there for me like even when I'm struggling. I think that helped me become a better person and more caring and realize that, like I said, **I have a worth, I have a purpose here.**

And I just sent her a message, and I was like, "I can't sleep." And **she just answered and was there and just was talking me through everything.**

I can always count on the staff there to be there and listen to what's going on, I can count on them to be like my second family. I am a student volunteer during the school year, and then in the summer I become a Summer Intern. My favorite thing about serving at The Rock is honestly I would just say just being there for the kids. Just showing them that there is someone there that is listening to them and will always be there. Knowing that these kids don't have anybody there for them, then being there for them makes me feel good, because I'm **giving them what was given to me.**




