

Dear Youth For Christ Partners,

When writing this I was reminded of the song "Oh How He loves you and me"! In times like these it's good to be reminded of that fact. My name is Greg Gudal and I'm married to my wonderful wife Robin of forty years and we have four children, two biological and two chosen through the foster care system. From those four we have 10 grandchildren and three great grandchildren. I want to thank my wife Robin and our wonderful staff, volunteers, table hosts, underwriters, Wedgewood Cove and program participants who have worked so hard to make our banquet amazing.

One of the youth sharing today helps me at our farm place from time to time and is learning about things on a farm. One day as we were unloading some old siding that needed to be burned he decided to take a break. As he leaned on the top board of the fence, he took off his leather gloves and gazed out into the pasture and relaxed while grabbing a hold of the hot wire and at about the time he remembered what he was now holding onto it was to late to remove his hands as the pulse of electricity shot through his body, resulting in a very guick hand reaction, howl and very memorable dance moves. The retelling of the description of the event played out for the rest of the afternoon as he showed me the red lines on his hand from the shock and how it felt. He only had to learn that lesson once. These are shared experiences because I have also touched the hot wire and remember the feeling well.

Young people today have been growing up in a culture of uncertainty and loss. In fact one thing that has been certain is change. Plans are made and then dropped. Loneliness and depression are running rampant, teen suicide is high. Fentanyl laced drugs are killing kids. There has been a lot of sorrow. In the midst of all this, youth have learned to value relationships. They want trusted guides for authentic guidance. Twice as many of them believe in a higher power then don't. Half of them don't know how to connect with a faith community. We must pursue them and let them know that there is a higher power and his name is Jesus and He does love them and wants to have a relationship with them. The Bible is truth, it is reliable and can be counted on. In the midst of the darkness there is a light and there is hope. This last summer at the Middle School Camp at Prairie River Camp we had 51 campers. 31 of them were from Albert Lea.

45% of them trusted Christ as Savior for the first time in their life and many more recommitted their lives to following Jesus.

Our staff meet with youth, run small groups, Clubs, serve free food to hungry kids every day and build Christ sharing relationships with them. The numbers of youth coming







We reach kids, serve meals, give out clothing, meet other physical needs, help with homework, provide rides to school, encourage, listen and provide scholarship opportunities for camps, trips and events. **Our Mission** is to reach young people everywhere working together with the local church and other likeminded partners to raise up lifelong followers of Jesus, who lead by their Godliness in lifestyle, devotion to the Word of God and prayer, passion for sharing the love of Christ and commitment to social involvement.

Campus Life is focused around the school and the lives of young people as students. Campus Life clubs are held before school or after school. The Campus Life ministry combines healthy relationships with creative programs to help young people make good choices, establish a solid foundation for life, and positively impact their schools. Like every Youth For Christ ministry, Campus Life seeks to engage these young people wherever they're found to raise them up as lifelong followers of Jesus. Outside of Clubs, it includes contacting, one-on-one appointments, building times, small groups, trips, events and camps. These activities are carried out by paid and volunteer staff who are screened and trained to work with youth.

The **City Life** Ministry is more of a neighborhood or city-wide approach with youth who are generally at-risk and many times lowincome young people. This Ministry utilizes more of a small group approach with a focus on meeting basic needs and skills training to encourage the chances of success of the youth involved. The City Life program is built on a relational context, is concerned about the health of the students' relationships, how many they have and who are they with. Additionally, the program is concerned with how a youth is doing in the spiritual part of their life as well as the moral choices they are making. How they are doing academically? Are their basic needs being met? Do they feel safe? Are they learning how to work and handle money? Are they learning how to give back to society? Food, transportation, homework help and personal hygiene supplies are among some of the prominent needs that are most common.

When I grow up I would like to become a Doctor, specifically a Surgeon. I want to help save lives and have lots of money. When I retire my dream is to go to the Bahamas and go snorkeling and learn how to scuba dive. And meet some sharks of course.

My name is Dalynn Wildman and I am an Alumni of Youth for Christ. The following is a paper I wrote for college in 2013 about an experience I had at The Rock as a teen.

I have been blessed to have witnessed several admirable deeds in my 30 years on this planet. One in particular has really stuck with me for many years. In 2000, when I was 17, I lived in a single parent home. My mother worked and did her best to provide, but she couldn't always afford to give me the privileges that other teens had.



One place that I did get to visit quite often was 'The Rock"'. I would spend many evenings there hanging out with friends, enjoying speakers, or doing activities. I even helped lead the group for the elementary kids at some point. In addition to all these activities, the leaders at The Rock would also provide opportunities to go on field trips such as a Colorado Caravan with activities like hiking and rafting.

This particular year there was a trip to Washington D.C. planned. As soon as I found out, I so badly wanted to go. When I heard that it cost several hundred dollars to go, my heart sank. I knew there was no way we could afford such a thing. I just figured it was out of my reach. One of the leaders of The Rock asked if I was thinking about going. I told them I was fairly sure we couldn't afford it. She then told me that there would be several opportunities for me to do volunteer hours and fundraising to try to earn the money. It seemed like a daunting task as the trip was only two months away but nevertheless, I told her to sign me up.

Over the next several weeks I worked many volunteer hours after school at The Rock to earn money for the trip. I cleaned and helped kids with homework. I picked up trash outside and washed windows. Finally, the trip was two weeks away and there was one more fundraiser. The fundraiser was a Dinner/Dessert Theater. People paid to come and eat and watch the local youth perform an act of their choice. We could either get funds by serving dinner or by performing. I wanted to earn the most money possible so I asked if I could do both.

I chose a song to sing for that night and spent a few weeks practicing it. Finally, the night of the show came. I was still \$200 away from my goal and would earn \$50 for working and performing that night. The night went by in a blur. I served spaghetti and ice cream and sang my song when it was my turn. After everyone left and we were cleaning up, I was a little sad it was over because I was wondering where I was going to come up with the remaining \$150. One of the leaders came up and said she had something to tell me. She said a couple had seen me perform in the show and had anonymously donated \$150 to my account so I could go on the trip.

I immediately burst into tears. I couldn't believe someone would do that for someone they didn't even know. The trip was amazing and will forever be in my memory. Even more so, I will never forget how two strangers would be willing to give up so much money to help a teenager to have an experience they might not have had otherwise. I will be forever grateful for their generosity.

Fast forward to today...I currently live in Albert Lea with my husband and three kids, and I am the Bookkeeper at Youth for Christ. This paper I wrote nine years ago is just one example of what Youth for Christ can do for at risk teens to give them opportunities to do things that might otherwise be out of reach. The people at The Rock were there for me at a time when I needed it and I believe this helped to set me on a better path in my life.
